We will also tour the oldest church in Chicago, the First United Methodist church of Chicago also known as the Chicago Temple. Located in downtown Chicago, this group of believers is very diverse and works to reach out to those in need in their city. We are planning to experience worship in their 8:30 am service on Sunday.
