THE APPOINTMENT OF PASTORS
IN THE UNITED METHODIST CHURCH



In the United Methodist Church, pastors are not members of a local church and they are not hired by a congregation. United Methodist pastors are members of the annual conference and are appointed to serve a local church by the bishop, who presides over the conference, in consultation with the eight District Superintendents (the Cabinet). This group of nine has the responsibility of providing pastoral leadership for the 1,200 United Methodist Churches in the West Ohio Conference.

Pastors are appointed one year at a time. Each year the Staff Parish Relations Committee of the local church and the pastor are given the opportunity to express their interest in ‘no change of appointment’ or ‘request a change in appointment’ to the District Superintendent. The District Superintendent carries this information to the Bishop and the Cabinet.

The Bishop and Cabinet begin their work with obvious ‘must move situations’ (retirements, change in status, etc.) and continue to work through the process of providing churches with pastors and pastors with appointments, honoring requests as appropriate and possible. Most new appointments are made to be effective after the annual conference session in June, but appointments may be made at any time of the year as local church openings and pastoral availability dictate.

In the United Methodist denomination, pastors are considered to be in itinerant ministry, where they regularly move about. This is a reflection of the early tradition of circuit riding preachers, traveling from church to church by horseback.

The United Methodist appointive system, imperfect as it may be, provides a series of important trade-offs for both the pastor and the local church. The pastor does not choose where he/she will serve but is guaranteed an appointment if they continue to serve effectively. The pastor does not generally have a choice as to their house or where they live but do not need to search for a house, does not encounter the expenses involved in buying /selling houses, and has the expectation that the church provided housing will meet with the conference-wide standards. The church does not choose their pastor but are provided appropriate, trained pastoral leadership without the time and expense involved in search committees and the calling of a pastor away from another church.
